### North Link light rail

North Link is a key part of the regional mass transit system approved by voters in 2008.

The 4.3-mile light rail extension project will provide a fast, reliable option for getting through one of the region's most congested traffic areas. North Link includes stations at Northgate, the Roosevelt neighborhood and the University District.

When North Link opens in late 2021, it will be part of the 36 miles of new light rail lines running north, east and south from Seattle.

### Roosevelt Station

Roosevelt Station, located underground just west of 12th Avenue NE across from Roosevelt High School, will have entrances at NE 65th and NE 67th streets. The Roosevelt Station will serve the surrounding neighborhoods and the Roosevelt business district, including Roosevelt Square.

By the year 2030, approximately 8,000 people a day are forecast to board light rail at Roosevelt Station.

#### Key features

- The station platform is approximately 70-90 feet below ground
- Includes two entrances with elevators, escalators and stairs at each entrance

#### Above ground facilities

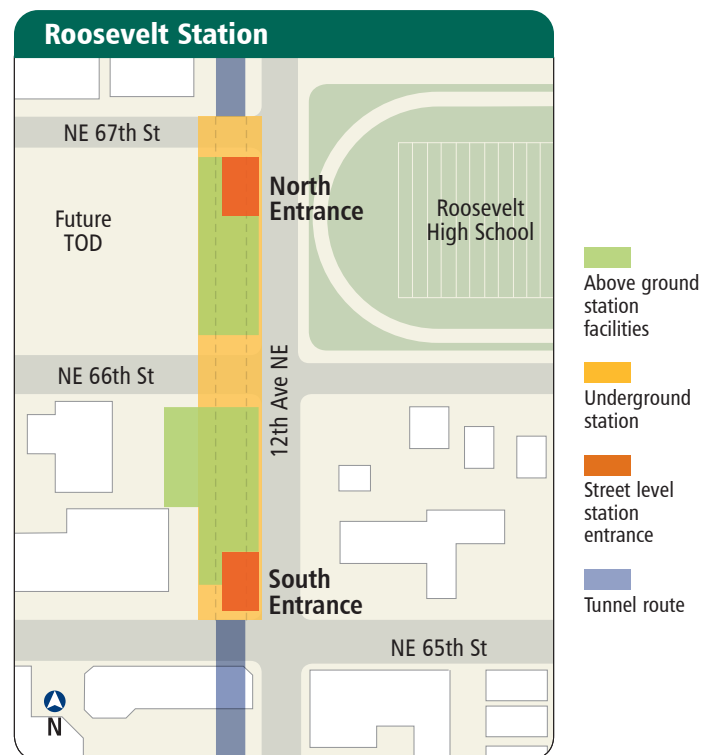
- Two entrances with pedestrian plazas
- Ticketing machines
- Bicycle storage
- Emergency ventilation structures

Final design and property acquisition work is underway. Sound Transit is conducting on-going public outreach

activities, including hosting open houses at key station design milestones. The 30 percent station design open house was held in May 2011 and the 60 percent station design open house will be held in early 2012.

#### Issues for final design

- Station architectural features
- Details of pedestrian and bus connections
- Bicycle facilities at the station
- Finalizing route of tunnel
- Construction schedule and methods
- Redevelopment opportunities adjacent to station
- Public art and artist selection



## Planning for the future

Link light rail is a big part of our regional transit system. But with one million more people expected to live here by 2030, more transportation options are needed.

That's why Sound Transit is working with the public and communities throughout the region to extend the voter-approved light rail system north to Lynnwood, east to Bellevue and Redmond's Overlake area via I-90, and south of Sea-Tac Airport.

### Roosevelt Station Schedule

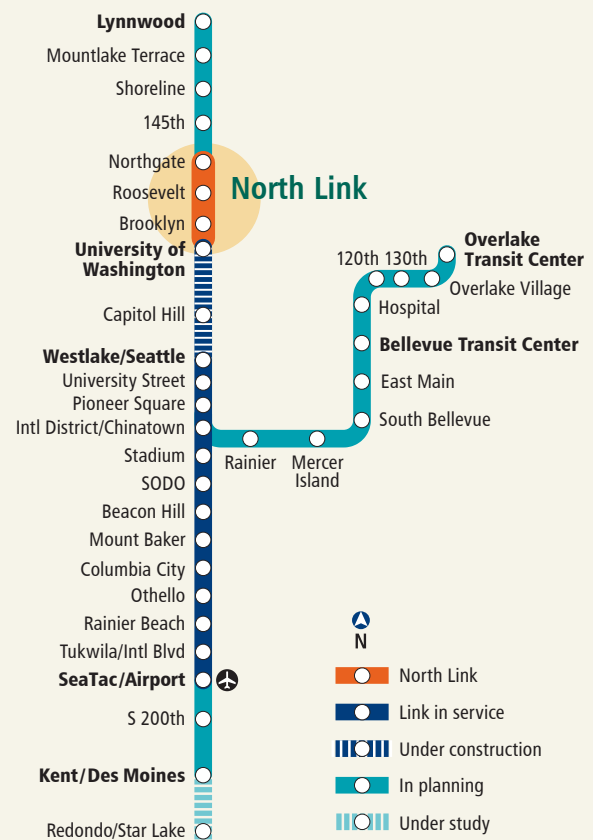
Station design .....	Late 2010 - Late 2013
Demolition & environmental clean-up .....	Mid 2012 - Early 2013
Station excavation & tunneling (Roosevelt Station to UW Station) .....	Early 2013 - Mid 2017
Tunneling (tunnel portal to Roosevelt Station) .....	Mid 2014 - Late 2018
Station construction .....	Late 2017 - Late 2019
Systems installation/testing .....	Late 2019 - Late 2020
<b>Light rail service begins .....</b>	<b>Late 2021</b>

## Link Light Rail System

In 2008, voters approved the Sound Transit 2 Plan, which includes 36 miles of additional light rail to form a 55-mile regional Link light rail system. Link will expand the current system from Seattle north into Snohomish County, across Lake Washington into east King County, and south of Sea-Tac International Airport.
